## An Easter Message

Following 40 days of preparation during the season of Lent, our Church immerses us in the greatest of all Christian celebrations. The feast of the Resurrection of Jesus is the greatest and oldest feast of the Christian Church.

The precise date on which Easter is celebrated each year is always variable. It can be celebrated any time between 21<sup>st</sup> March and 25<sup>th</sup> April. The precise date is set each year depending on the date of the 'vernal equinox'. Hence Easter Sunday is always celebrated immediately after the first full moon at the beginning of each year.

The most significant word we proclaim each Easter is "Alleluia". In Hebrew it means "Praise to God".

The significant symbols we use during our Easter celebrations are 'light' and 'water'. These symbols invite us to see everyone and everything more clearly: to recognise the dignity of every human being and the beauty of God's creation. The symbol of water reminds us of the wonder of life because water is the well spring of life.

My prayer this Easter is for each and every person who worships at St Patrick's Parish, Mortlake. I hope and pray that each and every one of us will be able to shout "ALLELUIA" because we have seen, maybe for the first time, the reality of human dignity won for everyone in the wake of the resurrection of Jesus from death. I also pray that each and every one of us will shout "Alleluia" because we have discovered, maybe for the first time, the wonder and joy of life. We have nothing to fear! We have only joy to celebrate!!!

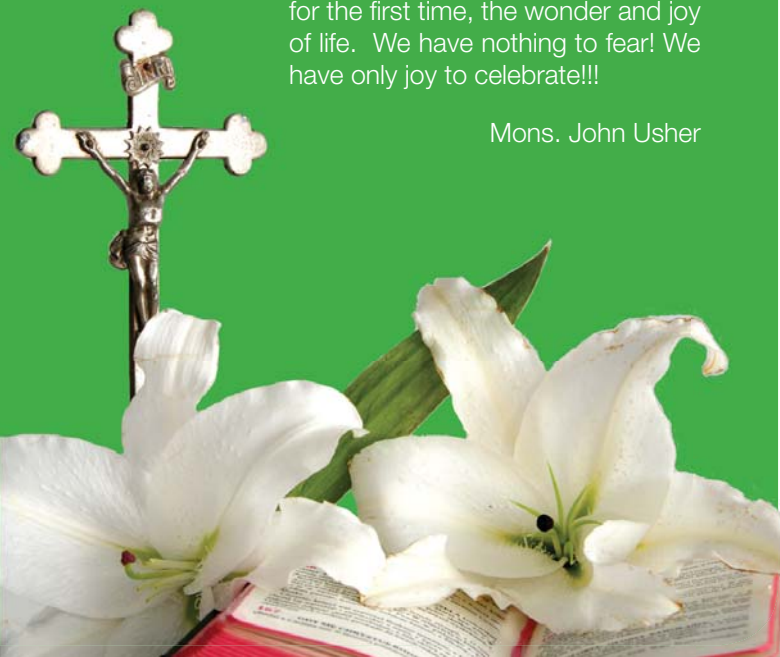

## Interview with Jack and Margaret Coulson

Jack and Margaret Coulson have been parishioners of St Patrick's Mortlake for over 50 years. Jack was brought up in Enfield and Burwood, and Margaret in Lithgow. However Margaret's family later moved to the Concord area where the couple were to meet at the Mater Dei Club at St Mary's Concord. This was a Catholic club for the over 21s which provided many opportunities for young people to socialise. They were married at St Mary's Concord in 1966 and settled in as newlyweds at their present house in Mortlake. Seven children were to follow: Mary, Angelo (RIP), John, Trish, Billy and twins, Judy and Margie. Sadly one child, Angelo, was stillborn. There are now ten grandchildren, so life has always been very busy at the Coulson home. Jack developed his business as a milkman in the Mortlake area, also working as a bookmaker at the trots (horses) and the dogs (greyhounds.) As a concession to family life, he had to give up working as a bookmaker at the country venues.

As a parishioner at St Patrick's Jack has a very commendable record. He has been president of the Parish Council, a member of the Finance Committee and an Acolyte, Church Warden and money counter (his former experience before his marriage as a bookmaker giving him considerable skills in this area) and also a delegate for a former Church Ecumenical Council. In addition, both Margaret and Jack were catechists, at Mortlake Public School and Concord High. Jack speaks highly of the various priests who have been at St Pat's, particularly Father Tierney and Father Morrissey, and of course Monsignor Usher.

Many of us remember Jack very fondly before his present illness, as he greeted people before Mass, especially at the 6pm Sunday Mass. He always chose, sometimes unsuspecting, young people to take the "plate" around. His bright smile, ready wit and jokes were a great welcome. He also was able to introduce people to one another, especially people he knew who had similar interests or predicaments.

Of course Jack has many memories about the parish, and some are quite amazing and humorous. He also has many comments about the changes in the Church and society. Jack and Margaret are very special parishioners at St Pat's and we have all been enriched by their friendliness and generous spirits.

There are many more stories to listen to and Jack is only too happy to share his memories and opinions, although one lesson he has learned over the years of his active participation as a member of many ministries at St Pat's is "to ponder before he speaks".
