FIRST READING

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah
Jer 31:31-34

The days are coming when I will make a new covenant with Israel and I will forgive their iniquity.

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.'

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

Today is the fifth Sunday of Lent. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and then we will have reached Holy Week. **We have learnt that to become closer to God we have to listen to Jesus, we have to try and follow God's laws of love.**

It's a bit like growing a plant from a seed. **Our job is to water and care for the plant.** Today's gospel story is a bit like this – we need to be transformed too as we grow in our love for Jesus. Let's listen to today's Gospel.

This Gospel is all about big changes. Change is often hard – changing schools, changing sports clubs, moving house – we like things to stay the same but Jesus is saying when he shows us a way to change that might be hard – **but that great things will come from the change.**

Activities to do at home:

- Check in with your Lenten Promises – how are you doing – it's still not too late to begin.
- Plant a seed and watch it grow! A good choice of seed is a nasturtium seed. It sprouts and gives good results quickly.

Next week is Palm Sunday, we might act out the Gospel, let us know if you will be coming and if you would like to take part. Being patient, never giving up – this is how our faith grows:
