FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy
Dt 4:32-34. 39-40

The Lord himself is God in heaven above and on earth below: there is no other.

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: The Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever'.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans
Rom 8:14-17

You have received the Spirit that makes you God's own children, and in that Spirit we call God: Father, our Father!

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

Baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, ‘All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time’.


CHILDREN LITURGY

In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit... I wonder how many times every day do we say this prayer. In our Christian lives this prayer is said when we pray, when we receive a blessing, at Mass we begin and end with these words, when we receive a Sacrament such as baptism, reconciliation, the Eucharist – but I wonder how do we explain that God is three persons but only one God?

It is hard to explain, and it is hard to understand. By our faith, we believe, through our prayers and conversations at home, in school, at children’s liturgy we can ask questions that help us to understand. There are many ways to explain the Trinity using familiar items that we know are made of three parts that cannot be separated without changing what they are – like an apple, or an egg or a triangle or even a Shamrock – the symbol St Patrick used! There is one big difference between these examples and God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit, what do you think this might be?

Let's listen to Fr Tom as he reads the Gospel to us today – I wonder if you can guess the person Fr Tom uses to help him explain about the Trinity?

Jesus did not tell the disciples to go and baptise people in the name of the Son only, or the Father only, or the Holy Spirit only, did he? The Trinity cannot be separated God is the Creator of everything, God the Son became human, lived with us, died for us, and saved us, and God the Holy Spirit remains with us today. It is hard to understand three persons in one but the more we grow in our faith the easier it becomes to trust and believe in our faith. There are many examples of things that are three but one. None really explains the Trinity, but they help our human brain grasp the idea of three in one.
